A BRIEF HISTORY OF SACRED HEART CATHOLIC CHURCH

Spanish missionaries already served the Nacogdoches area as early as 1716, but the Right Reverend John M. Odin, D.D. established the first parish of Sacred Heart in 1847 with funds raised by Father A. Chanrion. This wooden structure stood for ninety years on North Pecan Street.

Through funds provided by Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Phelan and property donated by Mrs. C. C. (Louise) Rhein, Father Francis P. Crane had a new church building constructed on the corner of North Street and Mimms Avenue in April of 1936.

On April 26, 1937, carpenters dismantled the old Sacred Heart Church building on Pecan Street. They transported the lumber ten miles down the Old Lufkin Road to Fern Lake for the construction of St. Ann's Chapel. St. Ann's was completed on June 16, 1937, and it was consecrated by the Most Reverend Christopher E. Byrne. The church building was moved to Center, Texas in 1951, where it served as a chapel until 1983. The old building is now located on the grounds of Sacred Heart in Nacogdoches and has been restored.

In 1985, the Most Reverend Bernard J. Ganter, D.D., approved the purchase of land for the current church building. Under the leadership of Reverend James E. Young, the dream of a new parish church building became a reality. A groundbreaking ceremony was held on March 17, 1991. The building was completed in 1992, and a dedication Mass was held on June 26, 1992. The present Sacred Heart Catholic Church is located at 2508 Appleby Sand Road in Nacogdoches, Texas.

CONVERSATIONS WITH NEW ATHEISTS II

MICHAEL NOVAK

In recent debates several of the New Atheists have voiced their objections to belief in God and especially to Christian belief.

Question: Christians are required to have compulsory love and compulsory fear at the same time: to *love* and at the same time to be *frightened* by God. This is not the way to teach morals.

Answer: It seems to have worked remarkably well down through history. The Hebrew Bible says that "fear is the beginning of wisdom." This sort of fear is much closer to "reverence" and "respect" than to "frightened."

If a man avoided murder because he feared the wrath of God, I would count such restraint as a good act, although only at the lowest rung of the ladder. Much higher rungs would be represented by a higher motive: understanding the reasons for such avoidance, and/or out of love for the maker of the law (whether the Almighty, source of all good or the civil will of one's fellow citizens expressed in the law).

Since, alas, experience shows that there are many rough characters who heed no motives except fear, I would not count fear as a motive to be scorned. It is far from the highest motive. But if and when the higher motives fail, this one may stand sentinel.

Question: Christianity offers vicarious redemption. It applauds human sacrifice — one in particular — and then condemns you to punishment if you do not accept this cruel and revolting sacrifice, which happened before you were born, to fulfill a prophecy in which you had no say.

Answer: Every day, evolutionary biology demands the sacrifice of individuals (and sometimes whole species) for the sake of biological progress. Every war demands the ultimate sacrifice of human lives — often in the most cruel and revolting ways. All this would still be true, had Christianity never been born.

Yet if in a desire to express His love for mankind, the Creator wished to insert Himself into human history, and to give an example of the special meaning He gives to love — not *amor* or *eros*, exactly, but something fuller and richer, unique to Himself (*caritas*) — His advent into time and space would in fact be *after* the lives of some men and *before* the lives of others. That is what "becoming man" would mean, entering into finite space and time.

We often say of soldiers, "Greater love hath no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends." The Creator as creator could have done much less than that. Instead He chose to share our human lot of pain, humiliation, and ignominy, dying as a criminal.

Question: The desire for forgiveness — to be white as snow — is an immoral one. Take responsibility!

Answer: It is not immoral to ask wife, children, or friends to forgive us when we have wronged them. It is the responsible thing to do. Of course, our atheist friends do not judge that they have offended the God Who loves them by doing one of the few things He asked us not to do. Many other people know when they have deliberately done what they should not do, and failed to do what they should do. Some, even before they knew of the God of Judaism and Christianity, have wished there were forgiveness, so that they could start over again.

Question: A Virgin can conceive? The dead body can walk again? Nonsense!

Answer: On the face of it, these are startling at least. Do atheists, however, have a better idea of how our true God could become fully man than by way of a divine "Father" and an unlikely but carefully chosen Mother? Hundreds of millions have been touched by the beauty of God's inventiveness.

And how could any man lead others to suspect that He also was God unless He gave them evidence — raising the dead, healing the lame, giving sight to the blind — and maybe most divine of all, forgiving sins, wiping them away: "Go, and sin no more." Of course, the whole evidence of the way He lived and died must also be added up.

From the very beginning, many who saw and heard the Christ just walked away, unbelieving. The Creator lovingly preserved their liberty. His coming as a man did not overwhelm the minds and hearts of all those who encountered Him. Not then, not today. He shone His light before men, and many of them turned away. On one occasion when hundreds turned silently away from His words, He asked his disciples: "Will ye also go away?" Although He would have let them go, too, these few stood their ground. He did not desire the acquiescence of slaves, but the friendship of free men standing erect.

10 TEMAS DE LOS QUE DEBES HABLAR ANTES DE CASARTE (Primera Parte)

Sino tu matrimonio podría ser nulo...

Cuando leí que el Papa Francisco dijo «una mayoría de matrimonios sacramentales son nulos» casi me caigo de espaldas al piso. ¡Yo tenía la misma hipótesis desde hace mucho tiempo! Trabajando en consejería familiar, cuando entrevistamos a matrimonios en crisis, y evaluamos cómo y por qué se casaron, descubrimos que muchas veces se tomaron al sacramento como una simple bendición, más como una costumbre social que una realidad sobrenatural. ¡Por eso muchas veces la Gracia Sacramental no actúa! ¡Es sencillamente porque no existe! Ante la enorme cantidad de matrimonios en crisis, tendríamos que preguntarnos si realmente están casados «como Dios Manda». Muchas veces, la respuesta a las crisis está allí, en la falta de comprensión cabal de los efectos del sacramento en los cónyuges y los hijos.

Otro de los problemas generalizados que provocan crisis matrimoniales es el desconocimiento que tienen uno del otro los cónyuges. Se conocen, se enamoran y se casan porque están enamorados. ¡Y cuándo se les pasa el enamoramiento, se quieren «descasar»! No se entienden, las mariposas en el estómago fueron brutalmente digeridas por la rutina y ahora no saben qué hacer con esa relación que no funciona de ningún modo.

Por eso, además de reforzar la catequesis matrimonial previa y posterior al matrimonio, los futuros esposo deberían tener entre sí un diálogo que de algún modo prevenga y minimice el riesgo de estas crisis. Y, ¿qué preguntas deberían hacerse los futuros esposos para que este diálogo rinda frutos? ¿Sobre qué temas deben hablar?

1. ¿Comprendemos realmente el don y el misterio que significa el sacramento del Matrimonio?

El matrimonio es un sacramento y los sacramentos son signos sensibles y eficaces de la Gracia. ¿Y cuál es la Gracia propia del sacramento? ¡El perfeccionamiento de los cónyuges! Eso no quiere decir que mi trabajo sea perfeccionar a mi cónyuge, sino que tengo la ayuda de la gracia para perfeccionarme yo mismo en relación con mi cónyuge. Todos quieren casarse con el señor o la señora perfecta, pero muy pocos están dispuestos a convertirse en el señor o la señora perfecta para beneficio de su cónyuge. ¡Y en eso es precisamente en lo que nos ayuda la Gracia!

2. ¿Estamos realmente comprometidos?

Revisar nuestra voluntad de casarnos “para las duras y las maduras”. El noviazgo es el tiempo privilegiado de preparación próxima al matrimonio. Y tenemos que prepararnos para ser fieles, amar y respetar en la salud y en la enfermedad; en la prosperidad y en la adversidad, es decir, ¡Siempre! (o al menos hasta que la muerte nos separe). Esta voluntad de compromiso, este “para siempre” lo tenemos que proponer como tema de conversación en cuanto tomemos la decisión de casarnos. Después, cuando vengan las dificultades, (que vendrán) nos afirmaremos en esta primera decisión: “esta dificultad tenemos que resolverla, porque decidimos casarnos para siempre”.

3. ¿Cómo está nuestra amistad?

Parece increíble, pero muy poca gente ve a su futuro esposo o esposa como “su mejor amigo”. De allí que muchos crean esa frase nefasta “del amor al odio hay un solo paso”. No debiera ser así. La amistad conyugal se basa en la amistad previa, y esta amistad tiene que ser enriquecida todos los días, cultivada mediante el diálogo, la atención, la amabilidad. Y una vez casados, ese cultivo de la amistad conyugal tiene que ser más intenso, especialmente los hombres tendemos a sentir que “ya está”, que “ya cumplimos”. Nos disfrazamos de pingüinos, hicimos el ridículo frente a familiares y amigos y ya con eso le demostramos a nuestra esposa que la amamos... ¡No querido machito! A tu esposa la tienes que conquistar de nuevo todos los días de tu vida!

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4. ¿Cuántos hijos querrías tener?

¡Un tema clave de conversación antes de meternos en la aventura más grande de nuestra vida! ¿Cuántos hijos querrías tener? ¿Cómo los educaremos? ¿Cómo los guiaremos a la santidad? ¿Y qué pasa si no podemos tenerlos?, ¿adoptamos?, ¿cuántos? Cada uno de estos temas es clave, y nos lleva también a la siguiente pregunta, porque, como todos saben, para hacer niños hay que “hacer algo” antes.

5. ¿Comprendemos lo que implica la sexualidad dentro del matrimonio?

Este es un tema que puede ser difícil antes del matrimonio, ¡pero hay que hablarlo! En primer lugar, tendremos que estudiar, comprender y saber explicarnos las enseñanzas de la Iglesia en materia de transmisión de la vida. Si pudiéramos adentrarnos en el estudio de las catequesis sobre la sexualidad de Juan Pablo II (Llamadas “Teología del Cuerpo”) ¡Fantástico! Pero si no podemos, al menos leer lo que dice el Catecismo de la Iglesia al respecto. El don de la castidad no es una prohibición de la sexualidad, sino un modo de orientarla y dirigirla para que ayude en la santificación de los cónyuges. ¡No sólo es importantes saber esperar al matrimonio, sino cómo y para qué!
